Informal Discussion

How the practice is doing in terms of patient accessibility compared to other practices.

Accessibility for disabled patients, such as the self-check in screen being too high for a wheelchair user at busy times when there is a queue at reception.

There was discussion about how we want to meet, via Zoom, in person, and the time constraints. In addition to finding a Chairperson to front the group, as at present neither myself nor Sarah have the capacity. We are both happy to be apart of the group. I am happy to take notes and set up meetings, and other aspects of helping the group succeed, but both of us are not able to be Chair at present.
